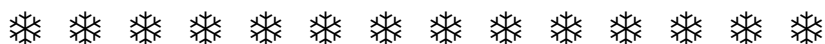

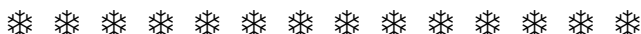

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. **Santa will be arriving to the parade in his own "sleigh." Please do not include Santa on your float or among your marchers.**
2. No alcoholic beverages or illegal substances of any kind will be allowed in the staging area or on the float or parade unit. The consumption of any alcoholic beverage is prohibited and all unit drivers and occupants are subject to Driving Under the Influence (DUI) and public consumption laws.
3. Absolutely **NO throwing** candy, brochures, gifts, or other materials to the crowd is allowed from any participant in the parade. Entrants may hand items directly to parade spectators but may not do anything that would invite spectators into the procession of the parade.
4. Failure by any participant to obey any police officer or parade official will be cause for removal from the parade.
5. No group or individual may sell items, including any food or beverage, along the parade route.

COSTUMED ENTRIES

1. All costumed groups must have some type of lighting in order to enter the parade.
2. All costumes must be made of non-flammable material.
3. Only U.L. approved wiring, lights and batteries may be used. For optimum lighting, it is suggested that lights be placed one to two inches apart. (Light reflectors are suggested for better illumination)
4. For safety reasons, only lights powered by dry cell batteries may be used for individual costumes.
5. All wires, batteries and battery packs should be concealed within the costume when possible.
6. The size of the costume should be constructed so that the individual can safely control it and can easily walk the over two-mile parade route. It is advised that you limit the weight of your costume to 30 lbs., including battery power packs
7. In order to keep the parade moving smoothly, entries will NOT be permitted to stop or perform reverse marches on the parade route. These activities cause gaps in the parade.
8. Chaperone ratio: There must be at least one adult for every 30 children.
 - a. All chaperones are required to dress in the unit uniform or costume.
 - b. Only children 8 years of age or older will be allowed to march in the parade.
 - c. Costumes that cover the head are required to have a breathing/communication hole.

FLOAT ENTRIES

1. A minimum of 60% of each float's visibility area will be required to be covered with electric lights: We suggest at least 2" apart.
2. Floats must not exceed 13 feet in height, 8 feet in width, and 45 total feet in length.
3. All parts of a float exceeding 13 feet in height must be able to be lowered in a quick and efficient manner.
4. All float materials must be flame retardant.
5. Portable generators or compressors used on the float must be securely mounted on a vehicle or other substantial base.
6. A minimum of 12 inches must separate any part of the generator/compressor from combustible material.
7. The use of public address systems for broadcasting commercial messages is prohibited.
8. Windshields of vehicles must not be totally masked to obscure the vision of the driver. If the windshield is severely masked, an observer must be used. Either the driver or the observer must be able to see the road center at all times and the driver/observer communication system must be separate, complete and adequate.
9. All floats will be subject to inspection by parade officials who may, at their discretion, enlist assistance from other agencies.
10. All vehicles are subject to applicable state motor vehicle insurance laws.
11. All drivers must possess a valid motor vehicle operator's license and be adequately trained to drive assigned float.
12. A minimum of one 2A/10BC type fire extinguisher must be provided on each float or unit.
13. Visit Yuma personnel reserve the right to limit the number of entries for safety reasons.

14. Each entry will be contacted at the email address provided on the application form 2 to 3 days prior to the parade. You will be informed of your line-up number and approximate position in the parade and what time to arrive for check in. Note that your line-up number or position may change on the day of the parade. All entries **MUST** check in at the official "Parade Headquarters" tent/table before entering the staging area. During the check in process you will receive your official position number and instructions for staging your group or float. Please have only one representative check in at the table.
15. **IMPORTANT!** The name/organization listed on your application will be the official name of the entry used in the parade line up. If your entry has more than one person(s)/organization(s) participating, please ensure every person from your organization is aware of the official name used on the application. If a person is checking in that is not aware of the official name of the entry then it will be very difficult to identify and locate the intended group or float.
16. The undersigned assumes responsibility for his/her group or organization's understanding and adherence to these rules. Please keep a copy for your records.

VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE ABOVE PARADE RULES WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFICATION

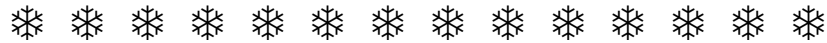

AWARDS AND CRITERIA

Floats interested in being judged in 16th Annual Dorothy Young Memorial Electric Light Parade will be judged using the following criteria:

- ORIGINALITY - Creativity
- QUALITY - Workmanship of entry
- THEME - Recognition of display of parade theme
- DECORATION - Quality and uniqueness of decoration
- OVERALL - General appearance, eye appeal and music

Awards will be given for the following categories:

- Mary Jane Allen Award for Best Depiction of Parade Theme (\$300)
- Float (\$250)
- Vehicle (\$175)
- Animal (\$150)
- Walking / Performing (\$175)
- Dorothy Young Memorial Trophy for Best Performance by a Marching Band (\$150) and the Dorothy Young Memorial Trophy. This is a “traveling” award that will be kept by the winner for the year, then awarded to the next year’s winner.

2019 Electric Light Parade Route

Parade route starts in the vicinity of 9th Street and 4th Avenue and continues north on 4th Avenue. Route then heads east on 4th Street and turns left onto 2nd Ave. Right onto Giss Parkway and left onto Main Street. Parade ends at Main Street and 2nd Street.



*All parade entries will be required to turn east off of Main Street and proceed to the designated pick-up location:
Parking lot area south of Giss on Maiden Lane
